image or effigies in the town of Basington and street called
Wimbley Street wherein there shall be all manner of goods furniture
Stock in the different trades of Cloth and Watch making & Silversmith & other
goods & with 2000 Pounds money and all property of whatever kind to my
belonging unto my nephew William the son of my late Brother John —
Gregory now of St. Ives in Cornwall Constituted and appointed Executor unto my Sister
Mary the wife of Abraham Cox aforesaid according to this my last will and Testament
and hereby give the said William Gregory to pay my debts of my Description

Chapel in my father in a very plain way a small stone on one part
in memory of John Gregory who died February 20 1780 aged 52 and another other
in memory of James Gregory of Basington son of John Gregory of this place who
died Oct. 26 1808 in about 3 Dollars to be my last will and Testament done

set my hand and seal this twenty first day of February in the year of our Lord
