will I have set my hand and seal the ninth day of August in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one and the thirty
first year of the reign of our Majesty King George the third our Great

 give and devise with book debts money and all property of whatever kind to my
 belonging unto my nephew William the son of my late brother John
 Gregory of Basingstoke whom I nominate constitute and appoint executor with my sister
 Mary the wife of Abraham Cox aforesaid executor to this my last will and testament
 and hereby I give the said William Gregory to pay my debts of every description
 with funeral testamentary charges and expenses fittingly to be buried at
 Lasham near my father in a new plain way a small land shown on a map
 in memory of John Gregory who died 20th February 1780 aged 52 and on the other
 in memory of James Gregory of Basingstoke son of John Gregory of this place who
 died 21st October 1780 the said James Gregory to be my last will and testament and
 witness whereof I the said James Gregory have to this my last will and testament
 at my hand and seal this twenty first day of February in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty six James Gregory (Jr) signed sealed
 and delivered by the said James Gregory the testator for his last will and testament
 in the presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each

 Cottingham share and share alike as they may each attain the age of
 twenty one years but in case of the death of any of the children aforesaid
 before they attain the age of twenty one years and dying without issue
